#### **ALBERT MOHLER**

Dr. R. Albert Mohler, Jr. is president of The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. He also hosts two popular podcasts and writes regular commentary on moral, cultural and theological issues. Albert is a theologian and an ordained minister, having served as pastor and staff minister of several Southern Baptist churches. He holds a master of divinity degree and the doctor of philosophy from Southern Seminary.



#### HON. JANICE ROGERS BROWN

Judge Brown was appointed to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit in 2005. She earned her J.D. from the University of California, Los Angeles and received an LLM from the University of Virginia. Brown served as a deputy in the Office of Legislative Counsel for the State of California, as a deputy attorney general in the California AG's Office. From 1994 to 1996, she served as an associate justice of the California Court of Appeal, Third Appellate District, and from 1996 to 2005, as an associate justice of the California Supreme Court.




#### PETER K. GREER
